WELCOME NEW CLMP MEMBERS



Coffin Bell, a new quarterly online journal of "dark" literature, wants "your waking nightmares" in the form of flash fiction, short stories, creative nonfiction, and poetry. Editor-in-Chief Tamara Burross Grisanti encourages submitters to "make us think in a new way. Give

us a new fear. Make our skin crawl." *Coffin Bell* reads year-round and publishes four issues a year, two of which are themed. Themed Issue 1.2, Monsters, will be released April 1st.



From Whispers To Roars

From Whispers To Roars, a new quarterly publication, was founded on the idea that "even the quietest of voices can roar." The journal offers weekly prompts to their online writing community. Writers can share their responses to these prompts on social media using the hashtag provided in the prompt. Select responses will then be shared them with the rest

of their community, in their mission to "blast your work to the world." *From Whispers To Roars* will begin taking submissions in February 2018 for digital publication, and hopes to be a hardcopy publication by 2019, if not earlier.



Publisher and Editor, Jason E. Gilikin of **The 3288 Review**, describes their journal as "an oversized critique group that decided to oversize our literary aspirations by starting a micro press, based on a single panel speaker's comments at an author's conference." They are currently focused on expanding their distribution market in West Michigan and growing their virtual services portfolio. They are now

partnering with literary non-profit Write616. *The 3288 Review* offers an annual house anthology (no theme, open to anyone, no reading fees, small cash payments), a semiannual literary journal (with Vol. 3, open only to people with a connection in some way to West Michigan - and no theme, no reading fees, and small cash payments),

occasional long-form titles and a growing services portfolio of free and paid online training, paid first-chapter critiques, and paid query-package critiques.
